Tim Williamson is an experienced project developer with 35 years business management experience in public and private sectors, government operations and energy management, with and a record of providing systematic financial, energy, design and construction solutions for the U.S. Government, utilities and independent power producers. Tim has successfully completed over \$3 billion in major projects for the U.S. federal government and the private sector.

Mr. Williamson currently serves as CEO of FreedomWorks, LLC, an energy development and consultancy service. FreedomWorks, was formed in 2007 to support unique project opportunities that catalyze and accelerate the global energy transition. Current FreedomWorks projects include: pipeline of new 10 MW p.a. wholesale SRECs; bundled solar assets sales in Washington, DC, Virginia, and Massachusetts; and project exploration of a 4 GW pump storage hydropower project in Grant County, WV.

Prior positions include Deputy Director at the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Energy Resources, Deputate for Energy Transformation, Office of Alternative and Renewable Energy, where he was responsible for promoting the transformation of energy systems to achieve greater efficiency and cleaner performance through use of market forces and innovative financing approaches. He was a leader in the Bureau's efforts to reform electricity and power systems and develop more efficient and reliable national and regional electricity markets. Tim retired from Federal Service in March, 2017.

Tim Williamson's leadership at U. S. Department of State included program management of enabling policy frameworks and facilitation of the design and construction of alternative and renewable energy projects, worldwide. Prior to the his work at Energy Resources Bureau, Tim managed a \$310 million annual construction program for 23 years, providing overall management of the construction, alteration and build-out of Department-owned and leased buildings.
